Oregon's Problem

- 7-15% chance of M_w9 CSZ quake in next 50 years
 - 32-42% chance of M_w7.5-8.5 SCSZ quake
- 3-5 minutes of shaking
 - Amplification
- Many structures not built to recent/ current code
 - Codes don't go beyond life safety
- Extensive liquefaction possible
- Extensive impact on W coast, Pacific












Chile, 2/27/10: weak soils (Y. Wang)













- Interdependencies: Lifelines
 - Utilities
 - Transportation
 - Fuel
 - Countless microbreweries and wineries
- Difficult to grasp low-frequency, highimpact events
 - Inadequate seismic knowledge + inadequate codes
 - Many "best practices" untested
 - Exercise challenges







Oregon Education & Emergency Facilities





- OR far from resilient to impact of great Cascadia earthquake today
 - Casualties (1,000-10,000)
 - Economic loss (close to 20% of state GDP)
 - More than one million truckloads of debris
- Liquid fuel vulnerability



2015 Legislative Session

- ✓ State Resilience Officer
- √ > \$200M for critical-facility rehab
- ✓ Funding facilitation for seismic rehab of multi-occupant buildings
- Liability protection for privatelyowned utilities
- ✓ Require insurance to cover 90-day Rx at walk-in pharmacy
 - Still need to address additional prescription for reserve





How Did We Get There?

- Direct engagement on policy
 - Help write legislation, serve as SMEs
 - Testify; trusted resource
 - Serve on committees
 - Write letters (within boundaries)
- Communicate
 - Can you get your point across to nonscientists without dumbing it down?
 - Trusted resource
- Follow up

- DOGAMI to adopt updated inundation zones
 - Science-based policy (ORS 455.446)

- Fuel vulnerabilities
- ORTF report intended to address first biennium only
 - Foundation of sustainable process
