- ➤ They are still selling their book A Different View at places like the IMAX theatre in Tusayan.




THE INTENDED AUDIENCE



YEC = Young Earth Creationists. Our book was NOT written for die-hard YECs, who have the attitude: "Don't bother me with the facts, my mind is made up."

LAY PUBLIC. The book WAS written for the lay person, both Christian and non-Christian, who "don't know what to believe" after being inundated by Young Earth Creationism for so many years. One important target audience is college students when they are learning basic science principles.

SCIENTISTS. The book WAS written for scientists, both Christian and non-Christian, because they are the primary group who can educate the public + their own families and friends. Professors of geology are especially important in this regard.

A-A = ATHEISTS-AGNOSTICS. The book was NOT intended to polarize the public into non-religious and religious camps, but to reach the "middle ground."

PURPOSE OF BOOK

To explain to lay persons in simple terms they can understand, why Noah's flood – as portrayed by flood geology – cannot explain the Grand Canyon or any other geologic landscape on planet Earth.

- To teach the basic principles of geology to lay persons by drawing them into the Grand Canyon using the most beautiful photos possible.
- To teach why flood geology is NOT science.
- To use our book as a beginning geology textbook in secular & Christian colleges and universities in order to educate non-science students as to how mainstream geology differs from flood geology.
- To use our book in seminary workshops to equip pastoral students to deal with their future congregations in the matter of science.
- To use our book as a training aide to geologists and others who want to know exactly what Young Earth Creationists/flood geologists are claiming, so as to be able to knowledgeably challenge their claims.

PSYCHOLOGY BEHIND REACHING THE RELIGIOUS PUBLIC

- The tendency of all humans is to filter facts to support their pre-existing belief system.
- The way people process information is heavily determined by their deep-seated values and cultural identities, so we look to people we trust in our in-groups to help us make judgments. (This can also be referred to as a "tribal mentality" where we hold the same beliefs as others of our "tribe" this is true for scientists as well as anyone else).
- Usually it is not an aversion to science that motivates people to tout unscientific ideas, but rather some underlying religious, cultural, social, or personal issues.
- We have a number of papers to come that will be discussing some of these psychological issues.

HOW NOT TO APPROACH THE RELIGIOUS PUBLIC:

"We must defend science from creationist assaults." The truth will, in the end, take care of itself.

HOW TO APPROACH THE RELIGIOUS PUBLIC:

- ➤ Listen with respect to what they have to say. Human judgments aren't based on reason, but on emotion, and emotional outbursts generate more heat than light.
- ➤ Do not "lecture." Speak in a voice that is trusted and likeable.
- ➤ Don't come across as superior and haughty. Stay at *their* level of understanding; if you don't, it makes no difference how much evidence you have it will all go over their heads.
- > Be kind, gentle, patient, and non-confrontational. Yet, don't back down on the truth.

WHY WE THINK OUR GRAND CANYON BOOK WILL BE EFFECTIVE

- Because it is unique. We don't know of another book like ours that confronts flood geology head-on.

WHAT YOU CAN DO TO HELP: TEACH A CLASS

Teach a *Basics of Geology* class for non-science majors, using our book as a text or supplementary text. (<u>None</u> of the authors get royalties!). Keep the geology very basic: include lots of questions and discussion!

Gear your class to a lay-public, freshman-level audience; i.e., to people who have very little knowledge of geology. (Not hard to do since very few high school student take geology). We purposely wrote our book with a basic-geology curriculum in mind. Perhaps teach it as a 2-credit-hour, elective, summer course, to partially fulfill a science requirement of your college or university? Retired professors welcome!

Emphasize the difference between science vs. pseudoscience. The public needs to be taught not to be so gullible to people who claim they are practicing real science, but who instead are promoting pseudoscience (like "Creation Science").

The purpose of teaching basic geology to non-science majors is to go "grassroots." That is what the Young Earth Creationists have done for the last 40 years & it works!
