

## TO APPLY TO BE A STUDENT ASSOCIATE OF THE GNGS, PLEASE SEND US YOUR LETTER OF INTEREST THAT INCLUDES THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

### To include ABOUT YOU:

- 1) Your name and postal mailing address.
- 2) Your contact information: email address and phone number.
- 3) The name of your school and your grade or class level.
- 4) If you are under the age of 18, include the name of one your parents and their contact information.
- 5) A brief personal statement (100–150 words) outlining what you hope to gain from this experience. What do you want to achieve? What interests you the most? Do you already have an idea for a project you want to work on?

**To include ABOUT YOUR TEACHER OR MENTOR** (A local teacher or mentor is required to be involved as part of the program. Pick someone you admire who is willing to assist and get their permission first.):

- 1) The name of a teacher or other mentor who will supervise your work.
- 2) Their contact information: email address and phone number.
- 3) Their affiliation (are they one of your teachers or someone else?). Submit your Letter of Interest with all the items above as an email to infoethegags.org. Include "Student Associate" in the subject line.

Following our receipt of your Letter of Interest, we will contact you and your Teacher/Mentor to schedule telephone interviews. We will have a list of questions that we can share in advance of the interviews, and we will have assigned a GNGS representative to act as a Sponsor. If we conclude that you qualify, you and your Teacher/Mentor will be asked to sign a working agreement that sets out expectations, obligations, and liabilities. And then we will be off and running!
